Using questions

A question in public speaking always makes the audience pay attention. There are three kinds of questions commonly used in speeches.

- **1 Hook questions** are interesting questions that the audience will want to know the answer to, e.g. *What makes a city great?*
- **2 Rhetorical questions** are questions that do not need an answer, because it is so obvious, e.g. *Who wouldn't want a change like this to happen?*
- **3 Hypophora** is a question that the speaker presents as if coming from the audience, which he/she then immediately answers, e.g. *Why do we need this? Let me tell you ...*
